

THE BATTLE'S OVER

On the evening of 11th November 2018, as part of the Nation's Tribute to mark day 100 years ago when the guns fell silent at the end of the First World War, the Bix Branch of the Royal British Legion, together with the Bix, Pishill with Stonor and Swyncombe Parish Councils are organising a short simple ceremony on Bix Common.

The ceremony, which will be identical to those taking place throughout the United Kingdom, will enable individuals to commemorate those who gave their lives or returned home wounded during or after the First World War.
