7. <u>Community Governance Review</u> SODC Strategic Management Board had informed the Parish Council that the property known as 'Greenhill' will be moved from Watlington into Pishill with Stonor Parish, but the boundary between P-w-S and Swyncombe will remain unchanged. There will be no change to the boundary between Pyrton and Watlington near Christmas Common, but land from P-w-S will be moved into Watlington Parish from Christmas Common.

There are two means of re<br>information; via a Forum and through Better Broadband for Oxfordsh<br>Contact direct with OCC is always referred back to these two sources<br>Essentially, faster broadband will be rolled out firstly to those commu-<br>living closest to an exchange, and those which have the largest numbe<br>households. There are 3 maps available on Better Broadband for Ox-<br>each one of which shows the P-w-S area as being low priority, with n<br>on copper wire being planned for at least a year.<br>Broadband is delivered through the green 'cabinets' situated at interv<br>the BT network. Although there is one in Stonor, this is served from<br>Heath via Southend Common - a lengthy stretch and too far from Tur-<br>for it to be utilised satisfactorily; high speed broadband does need dif<br>cabinets and additional electricity supply to the cabinet is also require<br>Satellite provision was discussed; Mr. Barton (Pishill) reported that th<br>satisfactory service, costing approx. £4-500 for the satellite and £25-<br>delivering 10-30 megabits; there is a delay when connecting. Satell<br>provision is not to be confused with Skye, which provides TV througl<br>satellite, but broadband through BT cables.<br>Mr. Haq suggested that the quickest route to achieving service may be<br>satellite broadband, although as a community it may be possible to jo<br>and approach a large broadband provider independently.<br>Mr. Haq outlined the Binfield Heath initiative where the community h<br>raised £50,000 to receive fibre broadband via 4G mobile signal:<br>noted that signal strength diminishes from 4G maximum as the distan<br>away from the supply.<br>Mr. Haq was asked by the councillors to contact an independent provi<br>"Gigaclear" to obtain an opinion on whether a broadband service is fe<br>in the locality.
