'Let is Bee' a success: SODC allowed nature to take over at <u>17 specific sites</u> in parks and open spaces to make them more bird, bee and butterfly friendly. Across these sites, council parks teams have reported an increase in the abundance of wildflowers and plants.

Celebrating World EV day: SODC is marking <u>World Electric Vehicle (EV) day</u> on 9th September – an annual event to highlight the progress in e-mobility and promote the shift to electrified transport. EV charging companies are offering deals – including free charging – across Oxfordshire.

Views sought on S. Oxon landscape character: An <u>online consultation hub</u> has been launched for the 2023 update of landscape character evidence for South Oxfordshire District Council. The aim is to support the work of the Council and to underpin policies in the emerging Joint Local Plan by reviewing and refreshing landscape evidence.

Bathing water: SODC is supporting Wallingford's application for bathing water status. Charity Thames21 are submitting the application and have launched a public consultation.

£50,000 fund for climate and nature: SODC is funding a £50,000 grant pot for projects to enhance nature and biodiversity and access to it. Applications for grants between £1000 and £15000 should be made to The <u>Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment</u> (TOE). Deadline 2nd October. Contact: admin@trustforoxfordshire.org.uk

Councillor community grants: A budget of £5,000 is available to each councillor. Applications are made online and are open until <u>20 October 2023</u>.
